In 2010, Clifford pioneered research into the legal and risk barriers that inhibit SME participation in public procurement. This has had a transformational impact on 5 substantial non-academic communities: **SMEs** have benefited from improved access to public contract opportunities; **Local Authorities** have reduced procurer-evaluation hours and process times; the **Welsh Government** have implemented a Supplier Qualification Information Database tool improving tender-entry for SMEs; **Representative Bodies** (e.g. Confederation of British Industry) have extensively quoted our research findings to lobby Government to eradicate SME tendering barriers and our Tender Review Instrument has been adopted by **International Agencies** such as the Canadian Government.
